

Ice cream paradise: In Cuba, both tourists and locals can indulge in ice cream to their hearts' content, and for very little cost, when they visit Parque Coppelia in Havana. Also known as la catedral de helado (the ice cream cathedral), this venue serves an astounding 30,000 ice cream lovers per day.
